
Solar. While the 30% Fed Tax Credit to **purchase** solar is gone for homeowners, **leases or power purchase agreements** will allow licensed solar vendors to factor in this credit until 12/31/27. Find Solar vendors at the CTEnergyNetwork.org site or use the QR code above.

CPACE (Commercial Property Assessed Clean Energy). CPACE is an upfront financing mechanism for energy efficiency, renewable energy, or other related projects. Towns must enable this. Repayment is made via the property tax bill.
