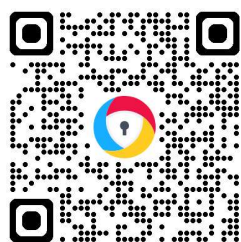

Connecticut's energy programs are fairly stable, but it's a good idea to consult a tax professional where federal programs are involved.

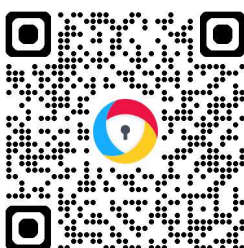

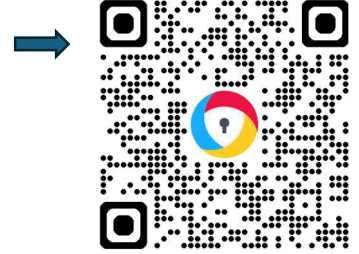
Solar. The 30% Fed Tax Credit for homeowners is still in play until 12/31/27 **only** for solar **leases or power purchase agreements**. These allow licensed solar vendors to factor the credit into your monthly bill. Getting three quotes is always a good idea. ← **Energy Storage Solutions (Batteries).** EnergyStorageCT.com.

There is compensation for batteries that dispatch to the grid during high demand, which reduces the need for dirty and expensive fossil fuel units. When paired with solar, this can be a robust backup power solution.

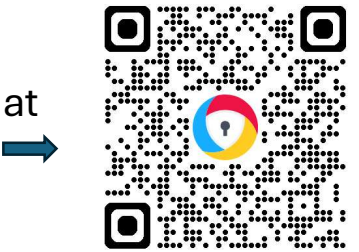
